
Amusement Ride Checklist Information

Definitions for Amusement Rides:

An **amusement ride** is described as a system that moves people through a fixed course within a defined area for the purpose of amusement.

Additional information for completing Amusement Ride checklist:

- Transportation vehicles such as trams and gondolas are addressed under different guidelines.
- Mobile or portable rides such as those in traveling carnivals are not required to comply.
- Rides that are operated by the rider, such as bumper cars and co-carts are not required to comply, but should have an accessible route of travel and a 60 inch turning space at load and unload areas.
- Children's rides are only required to have an accessible route of travel and a 60 inch turning space at load and unload areas. Accompanying adults are expected to provide transfer as needed.
- Each amusement ride must provide at least one wheelchair space or at least one seat designed for transferring. When possible, operators are encouraged to provide more than one seat.
- For each ride, an accessible route of travel must exist to and from all loading and unloading areas.
- The floor or ground surface of wheelchair spaces shall be stable and firm.
- Wheelchair spaces shall provide a clear width of 30 inches minimum and a clear length of 48 inches minimum measured to 9 inches minimum above the floor surface.
