Library Checklist Information

Definitions for Libraries:

- Circulation desk is the area where information is provided and materials are checked in and out.
- Study carrels or reading areas are desks or tables which provide work space.
- Screen-magnification software—program that allows patrons with low vision to access computer information by enlarging the screen display or tailoring the display to accommodate their disability.
- JAWS screen reader—this program enables individuals who are blind or visually impaired to access the information on a computer screen through voice output.
- Open Book text reader—helps those with low or no vision. Scans printed text and verbalizes the text via synthetic speech.
- Braille Translating Software—program that, like a word processor, allows users to type text, then translate it into Braille. A Braille
 embosser produces hardcopy.
- Kurzweil—program that increases reading speed and comprehension through simultaneous spoken word and highlighting of text.

Additional information for completing the Library Checklist:

In areas used for transactions where counters are provided for distribution of goods or services to the public, at least one of each type shall have a portion of the counter with a maximum height of 36 inches above the finish floor. It shall be on an accessible route.
