Sport Facility Checklist Information

Definitions for Sport Facilities:

• Wheelchair Seating provides space for someone to sit while remaining in their wheelchair. Seating must be available on a firm and stable surface, such as concrete or pavement and be on an accessible route of travel that is at least 36" wide.

Additional information for completing the Sport Facility checklist:

An accessible route is required to connect to the boundary of each area of sport activity. Examples of areas of sport activity include: soccer fields, basketball courts, baseball fields, running tracks, skating rinks, and the area surrounding a piece of gymnastic equipment. While the size of an area of sport activity may vary from sport to sport, each includes only the space needed to play. Where multiple sports fields or courts are provided, an accessible route is required to each field or area of sport activity


Wheelchair spaces shall adjoin accessible routes. Accessible routes shall not overlap wheelchair spaces.

Companion seats shall be located to provide shoulder alignment with adjacent wheelchair spaces. Companion seats shall be permitted to be movable. Companion seats shall be equivalent in size, quality, comfort, and amenities to the seating in the immediate area.

The requirement that wheelchair spaces be an "integral part of the seating plan" means that wheelchair spaces must be placed within the footprint of the seating area. Wheelchair spaces cannot be segregated from seating areas. For example, it would be unacceptable to place only the wheelchair spaces, or only the wheelchair spaces and their associated companion seats, outside the seating areas defined by risers in an assembly area.

The top of the bench seat surface shall be 17" minimum and 19" maximum above the finished floor or ground.

A **line of sight** allows a person using a wheelchair to see between the heads and over the shoulders of the persons standing in the row immediately in front and over the heads of the persons standing two rows in front of them.
