Swimming/Wading Pool Checklist Information

Definitions for Swimming/Wading Pools:

- **Pool lift** is a piece of equipment which transfers a person directly into the water.
- Transfer wall allows a person to transfer from a wheelchair to a raised wall surrounding the spa or hot tub. The depth (how wide the wall is) of the transfer wall must be 12 inches minimum and 16 inches maximum.
- Transfer systems include raised platforms or stairs that allow a person to transfer to the stairs or platform to enter and exit the water.
- **Zero Depth or Sloped Entry** provides a ramp that provides access into the pool. There is a section of the pool where the water depth at the pool entry/edge is level with the ground (zero or near zero depth) and gradually gets deeper.

Additional information for completing Swimming/Wading Pool Checklist:

Swimming must have at least two accessible means of entering the pool. Accessible means of entry shall be swimming pool lifts, sloped entries, transfer walls, or transfer systems.

EXCEPTION: Pools that are less than 300 linear feet are only required to have one accessible means of entry. The one accessible means must be either a pool lift or sloped entry.

Wading pools must have a sloped entry.

Pool lifts shall be located where the water level does not exceed 48". The lift shall be capable of unassisted operation from both the deck and water levels. Controls and operating mechanisms shall be unobstructed when the lift is in use.

Where more than one means of access is provided into the water, it is recommended that the means be different. Providing different means of access will better serve the varying needs of people with disabilities in getting into and out of a swimming pool. It is also recommended that where two or more means of access are provided, they not be provided in the same location in the pool. Different locations will provide increased options for entry and exit, especially in larger pools.
